Remembering the Wondrous Work of God

I enjoy the start of a new year. As much as I prefer the warmth of summer, the fresh beginning of January has become a great encouragement as I consider how I desire to grow in the next year. My gaze naturally looks ahead at what can be. But it's also important to slow down and reflect upon what God has done. Throughout Scripture, God commands us to remember his saving acts of grace for his people. The Passover and the Day of Atonement were Old Testament forms of remembrance, while the Lord's Supper is a New Covenant form of remembrance for the church.

Just this week, our entire staff spent an hour together, remembering what God has done in and through Harvest USA in 2024.

To start, Harvest USA is made up of people—God's beloved sons and daughters. Last year, we welcomed Christian Lewis and Stephen Moss to the team, and both have already been so strategically important to the growth and impact of our ministry. And already in 2025, we welcomed Cathrine Krasinski to our Women's Ministry team. Harvest USA now has 16 staff members pouring themselves out for the good of the church, and we continue to pray for God to call more servants to this needed ministry.

It's been 14 months since we launched our new website, and we couldn't be more thankful for the improvements—and the fruit they have borne. We've doubled the number of people coming to our site, and those people are spending more time reading our content and finding the help they need. We also launched our new online video course platform, and with our first two courses for parents, we've already seen over 1,600 students register from all over the

world. We're pleased to start the spring of 2025 by launching our newest course, "Transforming Love: Women, Sexual Struggles, and Help in Christ." And coming this summer, we're excited to announce another course, "Hope in Your Heartbreak: First Steps for Sexually Betrayed Wives."

But not everyone who needs help is coming to our website directly. Instead, they're finding us on social media and podcast apps. In November of last year, we completely revamped our social media strategy, and we rang in the new year by launching our first-ever podcast. By the end of 2025, we expect our podcast to have close to 100 episodes released. We've also been more intentional in partnering with like-minded ministries. We've done guest appearances on podcasts like the Becket Cook Show and Reformed Forum, as well as marketing campaigns with World Magazine, Tim Challies, and Westminster Theological Seminary. Ellen Dykas also had the great opportunity of partnering with the Presbyterian Church in America as a speaker for their eight-city tour of Made for More conferences. Our teaching and exhibiting team participated in 69 different in-person events countrywide.

And by God's amazing grace, our direct ministry team continued ministering to men, women, and families impacted by sexual sin. We ministered to more than 200 people last year through one-on-one discipleship, biblical support groups, and church consultations.

All praise to God for his work through broken jars of clay. Thank you for your prayers. The Lord hears them, and he has been answering them with abundant grace. We all need fresh mercy each day. By God's grace, we desire even more fruit to abound to his praise through Harvest USA.

BROTHERS DWELLING IN UNITY TO FIGHT SEXUAL SIN

To summarize the Harvest USA Men's Ministry vision in one verse, I would pick the first verse of Psalm 133: "Behold, how good and pleasant it is when brothers dwell in unity!" Cassiodorus, an ancient Roman statesman, once commented on this Psalm: "What can be more pleasant than to imitate in this life what we know is granted us as the highest gift in the blessed land to come?"¹

At Harvest USA, we continue to hear one resounding comment from those who engage with our vision of care for men:

I thought you were just about stopping bad behavior, but now I see that you're really about transforming men's lives through growing hope-filled communion with Christ and his people.

Praise God, this remains our consistent course in every facet of men's ministry at Harvest USA.

We continue to offer short-term, one-on-one discipleship for men struggling with sexual sin. The many individual men we meet echo this profound shift from misery to hope. Guiding men through this territory of deep, transparent sharing of shame and suffering continues to be the powerful catalyst for deepening their communion with Christ and his people in their fight against sexual sin.

This is where our two-staged, year-long support group program (consisting of Foundations and Discovery) continues to put the men we serve into the trenches of practical maturing in unity with Christ and his people. My first support group recently graduated, and there were two generally shared thoughts among the graduates:

1. This support group served as a unique place for deep unity with Christ and his people in the battle with sexual sin that we had not been able to find anywhere else.
2. We want to bring such deep unity with Christ and his people for those struggling with sexual sin into our own churches!

Men all over the map are hungry for our methodology of unity in the fight against sexual sin. This is evident by their desire for future support groups and the influx of church leaders reaching out for consultations on how to start support groups for men fighting sexual sin.

In line with that, the men's ministry has continued to exhibit and teach at events countrywide. These events often provide the insightful opportunity to engage with all the lives connected to the male demographic we serve. When a man struggles with sexual sin, his struggle impacts others; they too need instruction, support, and care. So, in this outreach work, we can also serve the hurting wife, the confused teen, the flabbergasted pastor, and the tired accountability partner.

As our method of care for men fighting sexual sin hinges on their union with Christ and his people, likewise, our laboring in ministry continues through dependence upon Christ and his people. Our personal support-raising remains one way in which we lead by example. We endure in our laboring by faith just as we call the men we serve to endure in their laboring by faith. Praise God, myself, and my fellow men's ministry staff member, Yohan Huh Prudente, continue to grow our financial support with hearts full of abundant gratitude for all our ministry patrons.

PRAYING BOLDLY TO THE GOD OF ABUNDANCE

In women's ministry at Harvest USA, 2025 has already been a full and eventful year! I've been reading a little book called *Authentic Ministry* by Michael Reeves. In it, Reeves says,

Don't pray cautious prayers for little things that you can see to yourself. You are coming to a King: Large petitions with you bring. The greater your view of God, the more you will expect from him.

I confess this has been an area of much-needed growth for me. I've often asked God for "little things" that have seemed attainable in my eyes rather than praying bold prayers according to his power. Yet, this year I am seeing the Lord respond to our needs in women's ministry in amazing ways and increase our fruit-bearing through his abundance.

Many of you know that, as the Director of Women's Ministry, I've sought to hire a staff woman to join me in direct ministry to women (one-to-one discipleship and biblical support groups) for nearly two years. In the Lord's kindness, he brought Catherine Krasinski as a part-time women's ministry staff member in early 2025. Catherine has extensive experience as a biblical counselor and a background as a medical doctor. She hails from Northern Ireland, completed the CCEF certificate program and internship, and is a gifted counselor, writer, and teacher. But more than that, I've seen that Catherine is a humble, gentle, and prayerful woman who knows that Christ's power is made perfect in her weakness. Please rejoice with me in this significant area of answered prayer!

The team has continued to offer ministry and equipping to two main populations: women with sexual and relational sin struggles, and wives of men bound up in sexual sin.

Our wives' ministry has continued to offer biblical support groups for women trying to untangle the hurt and betrayal they've experienced from their husbands. Without exception, I learn much from these dear women as they demonstrate courageous faith, vulnerability, and honest grappling with questions about suffering and God's goodness.

Our ministry to women with sexual struggles has continued to grow. We've offered groups and one-to-one discipleship to women who are often isolated or filled with shame. We encourage these women to move into the light of their local church community for ongoing care and discipleship while offering care to them for a short season.

In the 2024 calendar year, with the help of two faithful volunteers, we ministered to more than 60 women. I had the privilege of training a missionary in China to lead biblical support groups with our discipleship curriculum *Sexual Sanity for Women*. We hope that she can multiply these groups for women struggling with sexual sin in China through her local church. I'm already delighting in God bearing more fruit in women's ministry now that Catherine is serving alongside me. Lord willing, in 2025 we will serve more women than ever before!

Our growing team is grateful for many who encourage and financially support us. You enable us to be sent, day after day, to serve and see the Spirit bear fruit in the lives of so many hurting women. Thank you!

OUR STUDENTS NEED A BETTER STORY

Sarah looks at the picture she's about to send Ben, and her stomach turns. *This isn't who I am. I'm not that kind of girl.* But she thinks about the attention Ben has been giving her lately—the hints he's been dropping about becoming boyfriend and girlfriend. She's always felt so invisible . . . until the last few weeks. She thinks about what the other girls would say if Ben wanted her. It's not like she's going to have sex with him or anything. It's just a picture. It's just her body. What's the big deal? With a rush of adrenaline, she hits send and holds her breath. Ben's reaction is exactly what she was hoping for. *I guess I am that kind of girl . . . and maybe that's good.*

John takes an anxious sip of soda at the youth group pool party. He catches himself staring at Mike again, and his stomach turns. *This isn't who I am. I'm not that kind of boy.* "John, are you getting in?" He shakes his head no, tugging awkwardly at his shirt. If he looked like Mike, he wouldn't have to worry. He would just have fun and be one of the guys. That night at home, TikTok's algorithm shows him boy after boy who all seem to have everything he wants. Some of them have boyfriends. Some of them look like Mike. It's just pictures. It's just bodies. It's not like he wants a boyfriend or anything. Hours later, he still can't look away. *I guess I am that kind of boy . . . and maybe that's good.*

What Do Sarah and John Need?

Both of them sit in the same church on Sunday mornings. Both of them know the Bible verses that address sexual immorality and can recite them like a rulebook. But when they look at the world, they don't see a list of rules. They see a dazzling, colorful, compelling story about their sexuality and identity. For Sarah and John, the world's story is winning.

Our students need a *better* story about sexuality—a story that is true, good, and profoundly beautiful. They need a story that makes sense of their confusing feelings and desires and a Savior who says, "Trust me." They need a story that gives them hope, purpose, and a glorious future. They need to see how their male and female bodies are created to tell this story of God's love. They need to see that the Bible is not just a list of rules. The Bible *is* this Story.

There's never been a greater need for churches to be equipped with resources that help them teach students this better story, and this is why Harvest USA's ministry for next generation resources exists. Social media is making life increasingly disembodied, mediated by screens and pixels rather than flesh and blood. Technology is making hardcore pornography and sexual content more accessible than ever before. Everywhere we look, our media tells us that our worth is wrapped up in what our bodies look like while simultaneously telling us that our bodies can't define us. Our culture's story promises freedom from outward constraint, but it delivers slavery to our inward confusion.

My job at Harvest USA is to equip churches and parents to tell students God's better story. This begins with Jesus, the Author and Hero of that story. It is his tender, loving look alone that can capture Sarah's heart away from hungry, demanding eyes. It is his beauty and majesty alone that can draw John's gaze from false idols of masculinity and acceptance. More than words on a page, Sarah and John must find themselves in this Story, rescued in the arms of their Savior. Thank you for your prayers and partnership in this ministry. Your support enables us to reach students, parents, and churches with God's better story.

DREAMING, PLANNING, AND TRUSTING GOD'S PURPOSES

As a ministry, we've been dreaming, planning, and brainstorming ideas to spread the word about Harvest USA. Some wheels are already turning. Our web and search engine optimization specialists are bringing ever more visitors to our website each month. We continue to connect with people at events, and we've had opportunities to partner with like-minded ministries and influencers willing to promote our resources. In fact, a recent social media sponsorship brought around 1,500 people to our website to download a copy of our women's curriculum, *Sexual Faithfulness*. As we continue to plan and execute, there are a couple of projects we're particularly excited about.

First, we partnered with a talented filmmaker to create a brand-new promotional video to communicate the heart of our ministry. Telling four parallel stories featuring sin, suffering, redemption, and grace, we sought to capture the story of God's work in the lives of those we minister to. It was a privilege to work with a team of talented creatives who brought that vision to life. By God's grace, we have a powerful tool to share what our ministry is all about.

Second, we started thinking strategically about how we could repack and redistribute the content from our resources to new audiences. Our fresh social media pages now feature bite-sized biblical content, sourced from our resources—quotes, mini-blog posts, and short-form videos. We hope these morsels of gospel truth will encourage people who see them and whet their appetite to pursue the meatier resources we offer.

Finally, we launched a podcast where our staff record and read their blog articles twice a week. This new medium allows new people to discover and interact with Harvest USA content. It's also an opportunity for those who already love our writing

to take this material on the go and receive encouragement as they drive, exercise, and go about their day.

WILL YOUR CHURCH SUPPORT HARVEST USA?

Let me ask you a few straightforward questions. I hope they stir your heart and motivate you to become an advocate for Harvest USA.

Q#1: *When was the last time your church offered an adult Sunday school class on faithful biblical sexuality?*

There's a vast need for people to understand *biblical* sexuality. If churches don't teach the truth, believers will too easily fall for the world's lies.

Q#2: *Does your church have any resources to help parents teach their children—in elementary or high school—what God's Word says about gender and sexuality?*

I hope it does. But if your church needs help in this area, our website has free resources for this very purpose—to help parents equip their sons and daughters to understand what it means to be a boy or girl created in God's image.

Q#3: *Does your church offer compassionate counsel and support for wives whose husbands have confessed to a pornography addiction or marital infidelity?*

Sadly, spouses are often forgotten, despite dealing with a deep sense of betrayal, and need the loving support of their church family to help them on their journey. Again, Harvest USA can help.

Q#4: *If a teenager in your church has embraced an LGBTQ+ identity, how will your church respond? Are there support groups to help families deal with the confusion and pain?*

Harvest USA has specific resources to help families understand these issues of gender and sexuality.

Q#5: *How can your church help men and women who wrestle with the guilt and shame of past promiscuity or sexual confusion? How can you offer gospel-infused hope?*

There are men and women in every church who are ashamed or afraid to share their painful brokenness. But Jesus gives us answers for the most desperate situations.

Pastors, parents, Sunday school teachers, and small group leaders need biblically-based tools and resources to provide godly wisdom and truth suffused with Christ's mercy and compassion. Harvest USA produces these biblical resources, and most of them are free!

Will you help us respond to the increasing number of pastors looking for resources and the many hopeless men and women seeking freedom from sexual addictions? Can you help us provide parents with materials they need to protect and disciple their children?

WALKING WITH PARENTS IN FELLOWSHIP & PRAYER

Parents and Family Ministry at Harvest USA is *always* a busy place, even though we (Joy Worrell and Joan McConnell) do most of our work online. Still, as we meet parents constantly through our intake interviews, we're glad to come to know them and are blessed to begin walking with them on their journey of loving a struggling child.

We continue to minister to at least 100 parents a year, primarily through our **support groups that meet on Zoom**. Many parents come to Harvest because they have found no support elsewhere, or because what they have found is unhelpful or simply unbiblical. It is a joy to watch the group participants grow in biblical understanding, get to know each other, and profit from mutual fellowship and prayer.

Besides blogs and articles, our major project right now is the new, additional curriculum that will speak specifically to parents' hearts and experiences. It aims to help them deepen their understanding of the Lord's plan *for them* as they seek to love their child and model God's truth.

During the past year, Joy and Joan have both been privileged to represent Harvest at large **conferences** where many people visit the display table and meet Harvest for the first time. Those contacts are reminders of the serious vacuum Harvest USA is called to fill.

EQUIPPING GOD'S PEOPLE TO SEE AND SERVE HURTING WOMEN

“Ellen, I just don’t have a category for women who are looking at pornography. I guess they’re seeking romantic types of images and videos?”

This honest and humble inquiry came from a ministry leader I esteem greatly, who helps churches develop Christ-centered and effective discipleship. His question prompted disheartenment for me. How is it that the need for redemptive ministry to women struggling with sexual sin continues to not be on the radar screen of so many church leaders—men and women alike?

This year, I’ve been on the road all across the country with the Made for More conferences, where I’ve been teaching. I’ve been able to share with hundreds of women the kindness and hope that God offers to them through Christ for healing, repentance, and the removal of shame due to their sexual sin and the sin committed against them. Over and over, I’ve heard women of all ages express gratitude that these topics are being addressed with dignity and honesty through the lens of the gospel.

It’s GO Time to Multiply What I’ve Learned Through 18 Years at Harvest USA

Conversations like the above continue as humble leaders seek to learn and confront the silence about sexual sin in their areas of influence. I am also seeking to influence, inspire, and share what I’ve learned as a ministry leader. Here’s how I’m engaging that call:

• Producing Content

My priority projects in 2025 will be to work on a second edition of our key discipleship resource for women, *Sexual Sanity for Women: Healing from Sexual and Relational Brokenness*, and to develop a comprehensive equipping video course for church leaders. Mark

Sanders and I will collaborate on this, and our vision is that this course will give church leaders the tools and guidance to engage in practical, gracious, and, of course, fruitful ministry to women and men wrestling with sexual sin and spouses impacted by sexual betrayal. We also plan to launch two new courses for women in 2025!

Please pray for me, as the life of a writer is not the glamorous picture sometimes depicted in entertainment. It generally is a solitary and ‘keep your head down’ kind of craft. It’s a privilege to offer Christ’s love and truth to a needy world in this way.

• Active Ministry Engagement in My Local Church

I’m not paid to serve at my local church but, as a staff woman with Harvest USA, the expectation is that I am invested in my faith community and striving to “excel in building up the church” (1 Cor. 14:12). This shared life with brothers and sisters—with whom I’m leading out regarding care for women in crisis, or teaching in various settings—impacts my Harvest USA ministry significantly. How so?

Harvest is a parachurch organization that exists to build up the church globally by providing resources for local churches. Over decades of service, we’ve learned that if we staff are not involved in a church ourselves, how can we humbly and wisely equip other churches?

I hope it encourages you that our staff team isn’t writing, teaching, or discipling people in our small offices and then clocking out at five o’clock every evening. We seek to live out, personally, in our churches, what we’ve been entrusted to do as Harvest team members. This, in turn, further equips us for the weighty work of equipping Christ’s church to lovingly and boldly proclaim Christ to the hurting. We’re grateful that, through your prayerful support, you’re part of this process, too.
